Nature Play

Our students have been enjoying the addition of nature play during our recess and lunch time breaks. Taking advantage of our beautifully spacious grounds. We have stick play and building huts happening around the back playground and we have added the very popular 'Friday Slope Day'.

Why Nature Play Matters

Getting kids outside and into nature does wonders for their development—and it's a lot of fun too! Whether they're climbing trees, digging in the dirt, or making up games with sticks and leaves, nature play helps build creativity, confidence, and problem-solving skills. It's also great for their bodies and minds—helping them move more, feel calmer, and



stay curious about the world around them. The best part? They're learning important life skills without even realizing it. So don't worry about a bit of mud—it's all part of the magic!

Uniform

As we move into the colder weather, it is time to consider additional layers of clothing for some extra warmth outside. It is also time to bring the gumboots and slippers as well as the coats and beanies. You may like to include an extra set of clothes if your child is fully embracing playing in the dirt and mud!

We will be encouraging our students to embrace the changing weather by dressing appropriately and seeking shelter during the drizzly rain. We will only limit the outside time on extreme weather days which includes heavy rain.

Fresh Air Fun—Even When It's Cold!

Just because the temperature drops it doesn't mean outdoor play should stop! Fresh air and active play are just as important in the colder months as they are in summer. Rugging up with warm clothes, coats, and beanies allows kids to enjoy running, jumping, exploring, and soaking up natural light—even on chilly days. Being outside helps boost mood, strengthen immunity, and burn off energy, which can lead to better focus and sleep.

Using Our School Crossing

We are fortunate to have a supervised crossing out the front of our school to protect our students from road-crossing risks as they walk to and from school. Supervisors help young children to judge when it is safe to cross the road as young children do not usually have a well-developed sense of danger or 'road sense'.

Crossing supervisors are responsible for ensuring the safe passage of pedestrians and controlling the flow of traffic on the road. They may monitor and report any safety issues in relation to the crossing.

I encourage all adults to set a good example of road safety behaviour by always using the school crossing to cross the road.

Parking around our school

We are very lucky to have available parking around our school. Please ensure that you are following any parking restriction signs around the crossing and entering and exiting the car park via the designated driveway. I also encourage you to ensure that children are exiting the car on the passenger side and that young children are fully supervised around cars and when crossing the road.

Please be aware that the car park on the school grounds is for school-employed staff only during school hours.

Read to Shine program

Our 'Read to Shine' program has begun. You will have received a letter if your child will be enjoying some additional support for during term 2. This is our expanded approach to the Tutor Learning Initiative where tutors work with small groups of students, focusing on specific areas where they need support. Nat and Kelly will be supporting students in reading as part of this program.

Community Support

There have so many parents, friends and staff who have contributed to the tidying and updating of various areas around the school recently. It is so wonderful to see the collaborative community spirit of Ferny Creek at its best. I would like to thank everyone who has helped with the gardening and planting, feeding our animals over the holidays, repairing or offering to repair elements of the outdoor spaces, the Democracy BBQ and Bake Sale, and the furniture rearranging.









Our Parent's Club deserve a special mention as they are often the driving force behind many of our school and fundraising events, including our Mother's Day occasion today.

SAME-DAY NOTIFICATION OF UNEXPLAINED STUDENT ABSENCES

FACT SHEET FOR SCHOOLS

Protecting the safety and wellbeing of children through reporting and monitoring of absenteeism is the responsibility of both parents/carers and schools.

Parents and carers have an obligation to notify the school of their child's absence as soon as possible **on the day of absence** using the school's preferred method, including use of an online IT or app, by telephone or by email.

Factsheet for school for same-day notification of unexplained student absences

New School Attendance Guidelines

From the end of Term 2 2018, all Victorian government schools must contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same-day of an unexplained student absence.

The same-day notification requirement supports the safety and wellbeing of all students. Schools need to know when and why a child is absent and parents/carers need to know if their child is not at school. Prompt communication also promotes daily school attendance. Going to school every day is the single most important part of a child's education. Children and young people who regularly attend school and complete Year 12 or an equivalent qualification have better health outcomes, better employment outcomes, and higher incomes across their lives.

Many schools are already implementing a same-day notification system. The Department of Education and Training (the Department) is supporting schools to meet this new requirement using available online solutions where practicable and ensuring parents and carers are aware of their responsibility to notify schools of a child's absence through promotional material including the Parent/carer Factsheet.

Schools and parents working together to support student attendance

Building positive and collaborative relationships through clear communications with parents and carers is critical to the successful implementation of the same-day notification requirement.

The responsibility needs to be underpinned by shared understandings and expectations about the procedures for monitoring, recording and follow-up of student attendance as outlined in the school's Attendance Policy. Distributing the school's Attendance Policy to parents and carers will help ensure they are aware of their obligation to notify the school of their child's absence and minimise the follow-up required by schools.

What is the school's responsibility?

- Notify parents/carers: The school must notify parents and carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained absence. This should occur in the morning allowing time for the parent or carer to respond. Schools can choose how they advise parent and carers based on their local context e.g. by email, push notification via downloaded app, SMS or phone call.
- Follow-up (where required): At times the parent or carer may not be able to be reached because the school does not have their correct contact details (i.e. changed phone number, SMS/email failure notification received etc.). In this instance, the school should attempt to make contact with any emergency contact/s nominated on the child's file held by the school, where possible, on the same day of the unexplained absence.
- Record student absences data: Under the <u>School Attendance Guidelines</u> schools are required to record or transpose absence data in CASES21, eCASES or a third party software which is compatible with CASES21. Schools using third party software are required to import attendance data into CASES21 on a monthly basis.

Online solutions to same-day notifications

The Department is committed to supporting schools to meet their attendance requirements through an automated IT platform where practicable. Schools can decide which IT platform to use and current options include:

- eCases (a departmentally provided adjunct to CASES21) to generate SMS alerts
- third party software to alert parents of their child's absence via SMS or push notification

Parent/carer's responsibility

Parents/carers are required to ensure their child attends school every day and have an obligation to contact the school to notify the school of their child's absence. Parents/carers should inform the school in advance of known upcoming absences, or on the day of absence as soon as practicable. In addition, in order to implement this requirement, it is essential that parent/carers provide schools with their most up-to-date contact details.

The school grounds are not supervised outside the above times.

While some families use the front playground as a meeting place, please know children must be supervised by an adult outside of these times.

LUNCH ORDERS

Lunch orders are available each Wednesday. There is an ordering system via the QKR app and orders must be placed by 8pm each Tuesday for Wednesdays lunch.

Late orders cannot be accepted.





STUDENT SUPERVISION

All bike and scooter riders are required to wear a bike helmet in Victoria.

Approved helmets have the Australian Standards Mark TM (AS/NZS) 2063) and will be marked as suitable for cycling.

Children under the age of 12 may ride on footpaths as can a supervising adult. They are required to give way to pedestrians and to wheel their bicycles over pedestrian and children's crossings.

Bikes/scooters can be stored in our bike shed during school hours.

Also, by law everyone must wear a seat belt when travelling in a car in Australia.
